General Description:

The Hum Sub Youth Achievement Award is inspired by the Buddha's parting message to his disciples "Aapo Deepo Bhava", or "Be a light unto yourself." The award recognizes youth with outstanding achievements in community service, leadership, research, academics, performing arts, and sports. We are looking for well-rounded students who are ready to take the lead and make a difference in our communities.

Award:

Four winners will receive a cash award of \$1500 each and a plaque at Hum Sub Diwali, on Saturday, October 14, 2023.

Selection Criteria:

- Winners will be carefully chosen by a panel of judges identified by Hum Sub Board members. Their decision is final and cannot be contested.
- What we are looking for:
 - o Outstanding Youth Leadership / Achievement
 - You played a major leadership role in creating, organizing, and implementing your project or accomplishing your goal.
 Show us how you impacted the success of your work.
 - Project / Achievement Impact, Scalability, and Replicability
 - Is the achievement / project's impact significant? Can your work be used as a model for other individuals?
 - Community engagement will be measured as per the rubric mentioned below.
 - Charisma, Personal Commitment, and Trajectory
 - What draws you to this work and what personal growth have you achieved as a result? What would winning the Youth Achievement Award mean to you?
- Provide two non-family member references to support your application.
- You may submit up to 5 photographs to support your application
- Provide a video response to this prompt:

The widespread adoption of electric vehicles over the next decade, if not sooner, is a given. However, several challenges remain. - NC-based applicants only
- Enrolled in Grades 6 to 12 on March 15, 2023
- Participation: Lead or a Key member (on high-impacting projects, it is okay to have others contribute)
- Accomplishments should not be prior to Jan 1, 2023
- One entry per person
- Previous winners are not eligible for the award
- Family members of Hum Sub Board members and Hum Sub volunteers are ineligible for this award
